In the name of God Amen I James Smith of Charlotte County being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect disposing mind and Memory do hereby make and Ordain my last Will and Testament

in force following — I give and devise to my sister Elizabetta Smith the tract of land I now live on being fifty acres more or less to her and her heirs forever — also my will is after my Just debts are paid that she Elizabetta Smith shall have all the residue of my Estate forever — Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Stephen Smith, Daniel Hendrick, and John Collier Executors to this Will desiring it to be my last — In Testimony whereof I have hereto set my hand and affixed my seal this 22^o day of May 1792.

Signed, sealed, published, & declared by the testator James Smith L. S. to be his last will & Testament in presence of Tho^s Williams, John Collier, Senr, Esther ^{my} Hendrick, Collier Hutcherson, ^{mark}
