and knowing it is appointed unto all men once to die, do make and constitute this
my last Will and Testament wherein I do say principally of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it and my body I
recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion
of my executors, nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of
the same in the following manner, I give, devise and constitute and appoint my son
Benjamin Child and William Child, Executors of this my Will - Then I give
and bequeath to my son Benjamin one hundred acres of land - Then I give and bequeath
to my son Amos one hundred acres of land - Then I give and bequeath to my
son William one hundred acres of land being that on which he now dwells - I give
and bequeath to my Grand son ^{un} eldest Child one hundred acres of land
Also I give and bequeath ^{unto} my ^{un} eldest Child one hundred acres of land
Child one hundred acres of land - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Emily Child one hundred acres of land
Child one hundred acres of land - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Emily Child one hundred acres of land

Also I give and bequeath my son & daughter, five head of Cattle, unto William
Childrey four head of Cattle, and my Daughter Emily Childrey 2. head of Cattle
unto my son Jeremiah four head of Cattle, and unto my son Benjamin five
head of Sheep, unto Jeremiah 2. head of Sheep, unto my Son Emily two head
Sheep. I give unto my beloved spouse four head Cattle, and five head Sheep to be
equally divided among all my Children at her death. I give and bequeath
unto my son Benjamin one feather bed & furniture, also one more unto my son
Jeremiah, also one more to my Son or Benedict Childrey, also one more to my
Daughter Mary Slythe, also one more unto my daughter Emily; also one more unto
my wife strength to lead her own disposal. I give one Iron pot to my son
Benjamin, one pot to my son Jeremiah, also one feather bed & furniture unto
my daughter Mary Shouter. And I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and
disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, Bequests and
Executors, by me in any wise before made, written and bequeathed, Ratifying
and Confirming this, and no other to be my last will and Testament. In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twentieth day of November
in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
