

I John Hainer of Charlotte County being of sound disposing mind memory & understanding do constitute make publish and declare this my last Will and Testament in the following I lend to my wife Elizabeth for & during her natural life a negro woman named Bidley and her child Julia and their future increase also a bay mare, my cart, two cows and calves to be chosen by my wife out of my whole stock and one third part of my stock of hogs, a feather Bed and furniture two pewter dishes two pots four chairs a large chest & trunk tubs & spails all my cloth spun and wove and unmade & all the cotton on hand and my great bible and cotton wheel and bands and after her death to be equally divided among all my children, I give to my son Isaac Hainer one young bay horse called Jack Fisher. It is my will and desire that all the rest of my Estate after payment of debts shall be equally divided among all my children. I constitute and appoint Joseph Venable Exor of this my last will & testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this seventh day of April 1791.
