 and Catherine Harrison the widow and executrix of the said John Harrison
 before the Court and the Court being satisfied that the same was the last Will and
 Testament of the said John Harrison the Court ordered that the same should be
 admitted to probate and that the said Christopher Bellows and Catherine Harrison
 should be appointed Executors of the same.
