Vill
Presently being sick and weak but perfect mind and memory answering
that it is appointed to all men once to die do make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament in the following manner and form first and principally
I give and bequeath my soul unto the hands of Almighty God
and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but in the general
Resurrection I shall receive the same and as touching such worldly estate
that it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath
desire of the same in the following manner and form, I promise,
I give and bequeath to my wife, Mrs George Leaten ^{one} Shilling and no more
of my estate, Item my ^{two} desire is that my three Waggs and my two horses
and my feather bed likewise eight thousand weight of Tobacco in the hands
of my brother John Lee and I Saddle should be sold to the highest bidder
and the money arising therefrom to be Equally divided between those
brothers and my sisters four, William Lee, Sarah Lee, Judith Lee,
Elizabeth Lee, Mary Lee, Ann Lee and their children, Henry Lee
and his wife Elizabeth Lee together with her children.

but if my sister Lucy Green should die without her body my desire
that her part should be equally divided among the eight above mentioned brothers
and sisters, I am I give and bequeath to my sister Anna Bracken my Chest,
I am to make no manate, constable and or do any my two Brothers William Lee and
Joseph Lee and my friend Abraham Hatchett Executors to this my last Will
and Testament and I do hereby disowne all former Wills Ratifying and Confirming
this to be my last Will and Testament
