and Running along Bryant Fergusons line to Joseph Mortons line, thence along his line
to the Poplar Spring, from thence across to Saddersales line for Complement including
my Plantation to her & her heirs forever. Item. I give to my Daughter Hannah Mullins
one hundred Acres of land Joining the part given to my Daughter Agnes and Running
across from Joseph Mortons to Saddersales line to her & her heirs forever. Item I give to my
Daughter Precious Mullins one hundred Acres of land Joining that given to my Daughter
Hannah and Running across from Joseph Mortons to Saddersales line to her & her heirs forever
Item I give to my granddaughter Leticia Mullins one hundred Acres of land Joining the

given to my Daughter Pious — — — and Raising a gift from Joseph Morton to
Ladies sales Live to her and her heirs for ever, Item I give to my Granddaughter Jane
Bower one hundred acres of land it being the remainder of my Tract to her & her heirs
forever, and my Will is — if she should die without heirs that her part shall go to her
& her Son James Bower, Item I give to each of my Sons five Shillings Sterling to wit, William
Mullins, John Mullins, David Mullins, Thomas Mullins, Joseph Mullins & Joshua Mullins.
Item I give to my wife Susannah Mullins the use of my stock of all kinds during her
Life and after her Death to be equally divided among my Daughters and Grand
Daughters to whom I have given my Land, & I do declare this to be my last
Will & Testament, and hereby disannul I make void all other Wills by me made
as Witness my hand this nineteenth day of May one Thousand seven hun
dred & twenty two.
