In the Name of God Amen, I John Roberts of Charlotte County being say
Sick but of Sound mind and memory, do make and declare this my Last Will
and Testament. In the first place I Recommend my Soul to God, and my body
to the ground, in hope of the Resurrection to Everlasting life. As to my worldly
Estate, I give and bequeath unto my dearly beloved wife Elizabeth, my
Tenderly Affection that I Love her for her only now and ^{here} formerly during her life, so
long as she continues my Widow, and after the marriage or death of
her, I will bequeath that my said wife and her heirs and assigns

Equally divided between all my Children who shall be then alive.
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Roberts my negro girl
 Uzo, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son
 Benjamin Roberts my Negro boy Pompey, to him and to his heirs forever, that
 I further will that my two Negroes Last Named continue in the possession
 of my wife and be for her use and service untill my Son and Daughters are of
 Age. viz, Anne Roberts and Benjamin Roberts. Item I will and ordain
 that all my Tobacco be sold and applied to the payment of my just debts,
 and if any of my debts shall then remain unpaid I will, Ordain that
 so much of the Crop which my Negroes shall make the coming year next as
 be sufficient, be applied to this purpose. Item I will and bequeath my
 Parcel house to my wife forever, Item I will and ordain that all my Stock of
 Horses, Cows, and Hogs, And my Plantation tools and Household furniture,
 And ^{all} my other Estate of what-soever kind be for the use of my wife during her
 Life or widowhood for the purpose of maintaining and Educating my
 Children and I will and ordain that after her marriage or death that
 they all be Equally divided between all my Children namely, Robert
 Crisp, Thomas, John, Anne, and Benjamin. In the Last place I will

and ~~ordain~~ constitute and appoint, my wife Elizabeth Roberts
Executor and my Brother Benjamin Roberts, Executors of this my Last
Will and Testament, hereby Revoking and disannulling all other wills
by me heretofore made, declaring and publishing this as my only true
Last will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand & affixed my seal this Eleventh day of November, One Thousand
Seven hundred and Seventy Seven.

In the name of God Amen. I William Redmond of the
County of Carroll and State of Kentucky being through Age weak and infirm
in Body, but of sound and perfect memory in mind, do make and Ordain this
my last will and Testament, to wit, I give bequeath to my son Redmond
Redmond all that part of the Tract of Land wherein I live, which lies on the
South side of the branch which heads near Randolph's old Road, and makes
into the Horse pen bank, just below Joseph Colliers Plantation, Beginning at
a Corner Dog Wood on May's and Joseph Colliers Line on said branch thence up
the same to the head, thence a Direct Line to Cole Carringtons house at the Top of
the Hill just above the old Irish Trap Land in Little Room oak, thence along
Carringtons and May's line to the Beginning to him my said son Redmond
his Heirs and Assigns forever, but in Case he my said son Redmond should
die before he comes of Age whatsoever then, I give and bequeath the said Land
to my son George Redmond his Heirs and Assigns forever, Item, I and bequeath
to my son George Redmond the following part of the Tract of Land and
Plantation wherein I live (to wit) beginning at the said Dog Wood which my
said son Redmonds Land begins at thence along Joseph Colliers and
Thomas Colliers Lines to Potomac River.
