

In the Name of God Amen, I John Stanton planter of the parish of Kennebec
 in Kent County, calling to remembrance that all men are mortal and being now
 in a sound and composed State of mind and memory do make and ordain this my
 Last Will and Testament, First I commend my immortal soul into the hands of
 God and my body to the dust to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors
 in certain hope of its resurrection, and secondly unto the worldly estate with which
 it hath pleased God to bless me, both real and personal, I will and ordain that
 it be disposed of as followeth, To wit, I give and bequeath ^{unto} to my son
 Zachariah Stanton five shillings - Item I give and bequeath unto son William
 Stanton two shillings - Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally one
 shilling named Poll and half of all my household estate and furniture - Item
 I give and bequeath ^{unto} to my son Lewis Stanton two hundred acres of land on
 Wallace creek on which I now live and one half of my household furniture.
 Lastly I desire that all my just debts be paid by Executors hereafter named.
 I constitute and appoint my Wighams Richard Gaines Jun: Executors, Mr.
 James Adams & Mr. Thomas Payne Executors of this my last will and Testament
 hereby disannulling, revoking and making void all other wills by me heretofore

in better hope of its resurrection, and secondly as to the worldly estate with which
it hath pleased God to bless me, both real and personal, I will and ordain that
it be disposed of as followeth, To wit, I give and bequeath ^{unto} my son
Zachariah Stanton five shillings - Item I give and bequeath unto son William
Stanton five shillings - Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sally one
Anne named Doll and half of all my household estate and furniture - Item
I give and bequeath ^{unto} my son Lucie Stanton two hundred acres of land on
Wallace creek on which I now live and one half of my household furniture.
Lastly, I desire that all my Just debts be paid by Executors hereafter named.
I constitute and appoint my Neighbours Richard Gaines Junr. Executors, Mr.
James Adams & Mr. Thomas Payne Executors of this my last will and Testament
hereby doth annulling, revoking and making void all other wills by me heretofore
made, delivering making and ordaining this to be my last and only true Will
^{and Testament} containing all my one half sheet of paper. In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this twenty fifth day of February 1783
