soul to that gave it me and as for ^{what} worldly Estate it has pleased God to bestow on me I give and bequeath
the following manner to wit I lend to my loving wife Martha Fore during her natural life two negroes viz
Hannah & Patty also one flax hackle one Bed and Furniture and third part of my Stocks of horses
cattle Sheep & Hogs and a third part of my land to include my plantation whereon I now live. Item I give
and bequeath to my son John Fore at the death of my wife Martha Fore the above named negroes Hannah
& Patty one Flax Hackle one Bed and Furniture & Stocks that is lent to my wife above also my land &
Plantation whereon I now live with part of a tract of land I purchased of James Imbrie agreeable to a line
shall run hereafter also one gun one pair of sheelyards one cart and one yoke oxcn to him and his heirs forever
I lend to my Daughter Rezia Mason during her natural life the land and plantation thought of James
Imbrie, one negro man named Joe one bed and furniture one bow one hunting saddle and at her death the
land and negro man Joe with the other part of the legacy to go to her son George Mason or such heirs of her body
as may represent him. Item I lend to my daughter Mary Fore one negro man Charles one Horse & saddle
one Bed & Furniture and at her death the above legacy to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten
Item I give to my son George Fore five shillings. Item I give to my Daughter Anne Trak five
shillings Item I give to my son Philip Fore five shillings Item I give to ^{my} son Phillips 6 children
to wit Molly, Peter & John fifty shilling each Item the remainder of Estate to be equally divided between
my son John and Mary Fore & their heirs I appoint my son John Fore and Joshua Wherby my

Trabue, one negro man named Joe one bed and furniture one bow one hunting saddle and at her death the
land and negro man Joe with the other part of the Legacy to go to her son George Mason or such heirs of her body
as may represent him. Item I lend to my daughter Mary. For one negro man Charles one Horse & saddle
one Bed & Furniture and at her death the above legacy to the heirs of her body lawfully begotten
Item I give to my son George For five shillings. Item I give to my Daughter Anne Five
shillings Item I give to my son Philip For five shillings. Item I give to son Phillips children
to wit Abby, Peter & John fifty shilling each Item the remainder of Estate to be equally divided between
my son John and Mary For & their heirs. I appoint my son John For and Joshua Whorby my
Executors of this my last Will and Testament as Witness my hand and seal this eighth day of Nov 1793.

This last Will and Testament of John Forc decd was presented in Court and the same was read by the oath
of Frances Thornton and Lucy Thornton and ordered to be recorded. At a Court held for the said County
the 1st day of June following. On the Motion of John Forc one of the Executors named in the
said will who made oath according to Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate
of the said Will in due form he gives Security whereupon he together with George Forc
and Francis Thornton his Securities entered into and acknowledged their bond according to Law
for that purpose desiring Liberty to the other Executors named in the said Will to join with him
