I Leave to my beloved wife Sarah During her life my Land & Plantation whereon I now live Together with my Stock of horses, Cattle, & Hogs, and three Feather beds & furniture with all my "visiduo" Household and Plantation Furniture to be for the Support of herself and her

Children, during their Continuance with her and after her Death my Desire is that my Land maybe sold, and the money arising from the Sale thereof to be Equally Divided between my

three Sons <sup>(N<sup>o</sup> 2)</sup> Nemucan Hunt Allen, Benjamin Allen & Robert Allen, and the Residue of my Estate to be Equally Divided between my three Daughters, Annie Allen, Jean Allen, & Lucanna Allen

To the Sole use of them and their Several heirs forever. Item I give to my Son Charles Allen four Shillings and I do constitute and appoint my True & Trusty Friends Daniel Congle <sup>1794</sup> whole &

Sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this Eighth day of October one thousand seven hundred & seventy
