In the Name of God, Amen I Joseph Perrin of Charlotte County being in perfect Health
and sound memory do hereby make and appoint my last Will and Testament in and to
form following to wit, that my funeral Expences be paid by my Executors I Item
that my dear beloved wife have the use of my Negro Woman named Ann and her Son
Wm during her Natural life, it is further my desire that after the decease of my said
wife the said Slaves Ann & Wm & the increase of them Thomas Ann & Wm shall be equally
divided between all my Children and each of them and their heirs forever I Item I give
and bequeath to my son George Perrin and to his heirs forever the Lands and Plantation
now lying on Twaddys Creek containing two hundred Acres be the same more
or less I Item I give and bequeath to my dear Daughter Elizabeth Jones & to her heirs
one Negro Girl named Palace, I Item I give and bequeath to my dear Daughter Sarah
Sullivan and to her heirs one Negro boy named Tom, I Item I give and bequeath to my
dear Daughter ^{Mary Buxton} and to her heirs the boy that she now has in her Possession named Peter
I Item I give and bequeath to my dear Daughter Sarah Sullivan and to her heirs
one Negro Girl named Lucy I do constitute make and ordain Josephus Perrin and
George Perrin my sole & full Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, Witnesses
whereof I have set my hand at this 22nd day of October 1772. J. Perrin. S. S.

At a Court held for Charlotte County the 6th day of September 1773.
The within written last Will and Testament of Joseph Perrin dec^d was exhibited in Court
by George Perrin and Josephus Perrin the Executors therein named, and the same was
Proved by the oath of three Witnesses hereto subscribed to be the Act & Dec^d of the said Joseph
Perrin and Ordered to be Recorded, On the motion of the said Executors who made oath according
to Law, probate of the said Will is granted them in due form they giving security, whereupon
they together with Thomas Ligon and James Sullivan their Securitys enter^d into &
