Charlotte do make and ordain this my last will and Testament as follows Viz. I give
to my son Ambrose Fletcher if he is living after my decease one feather bed also one man
scoll to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son Reuben Fletcher one
one Negro man named George to him his heirs forever. Item I give to Abraham
Master five shillings together with what he hath in possession. Item I give
unto my two granddaughters Mary Fletcher and Mary Fletcher Daughters of
James Fletcher one negro woman named Phill the child she now hath with
her father increase to be equally divided between them when they shall arrive to
the full age of 21 years and then this forever. Witness my hand

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Fletcher appears to this my last will & Testament In Witness whereof
I have set my hand & seal this twelfth day of December in the year of our
Lord 1782.
