Negro woman named Kate to her and her heirs forever. Then I give unto Margaret Parsons one
Negro Boy named Harry to her and her heirs forever. Then I give unto William T. Parsons
Parsons sons of William Parsons all my lands to be equally divided between them. Then I give
sold and then arising from the sale to be equally divided between them and I do hereby
do devise and improve my Estate to be made right in for simple to the same here for

and after my life do come
I declare that nothing above named be removed until my wife decease, all my estate that is now
not before mentioned shall be sold and equally divided between Mary Parsons Martha Parsons
Margaret Parsons above named daughters of William Parsons. I do hereby appoint and name
my wife Isabella Hanna and my friend James Garrett and Henry Madison my Executors of
this my last will and Testament, ^{as} witness my hand and seal the day and year above written.

If either of the Daughters above named should die without Issue the Negro given to her shall go
to the next oldest daughter and the money that may arise from the residue of my estate not mentioned
it shall go to the other daughter.
