

In the Name of God Amen December 7th 1798 I Molly Vaughan
of Charlotte County being of sound memory and discretion do, ordain
declare and publish this as my last Will and Testament I give and
bequeath to my son Archer Vaughan all the property that I have
now in my possession, consisting of one bed and furniture, two cows
and calves a small stock of Hogs and some household furniture
And whereas by my fathers will, I shall be entitled on the death
of my mother to one legacy of thirty pounds and to another legacy
of a cow and calf, My Will and desire is, and I do hereby give
and bequeath to my said son Archer the said Legacy of thirty
pounds and the said Legacy of one Cow and calf which will
arrive to me on the death of my mother. And whereas also
by the death of my Brother ^{Bailey} Vaughan, I am entitled to one
equal part with the rest of my brothers and sisters of the
estate both real and personal, which would have fallen to him,
my said brother Bailey by my fathers Will on the death of
my mother, I do hereby Will all my right, title and interest in
and to the said estate of my brother Bailey Vaughan to my
said son Archer leaving my said son my sole lawful heir
and residuary legatee I do hereby state that I have

estate both real and personal, which would have fallen to him,
my said brother Bailey, by my father's Will, on the death of
my mother, I do hereby Will all my right, title and interest in
and to the said estate of my brother Bailey Vaughan to my
said son Archer. Leaving my said son my sole and only heir
and residuary legatee of all my estate of whatsoever kind, whether
in possession or expectancy before and proposed of by me. And
Whereas reposing full and perfect confidence and trust in
W. Clement Read of the County of Charlotte, I do hereby con-
stitute and appoint him the said, Clement Read executor to this
my last will and Testament, desiring that he would take upon
himself also, the charge, direction and Guardianship of my said
son Archer.

At a Court held for Charlotte County the 3^d day of June 1799.

This Last Will and Testament of Molly Vaughan dec^d was
presented in Court by Clement Read the Executor thereof

the same was proved by the oath of Isaac Read one of the Witnesses
thence subscribed and the said Isaac Read being interrogated on oath
saith that Thomas Scott the other subscribing Witness who is now dead
did subscribe his name as a Witness to this Will in his presence, and in
the presence of the Testator. Ordered that the said Will be admitted to
Record. On the motion of the said Executor who made oath according to
Law. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will
in due form - he giving security. Whereupon he with Isaac Read his
security entered into and acknowledges their Bond according to Law
for that purpose.
