

In the name of God amen I Abraham Claybrook of Charlotte County being in a low state
of health but of disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament as followeth. Inprimis I lend to my wife Sarah for the term of her natural
life, my Land negro goods Chattels and at her decease, I give and dispose of my estate
in the following manner Viz. Item I give to my son Peter Claybrook the tract of Land
he now lives on, and one negro Dick to him his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give
to my son Jacob Claybrook the Tract of Land Jacob lives on and one negro Jesse to him
his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give to my daughter Mary Vernon one negro woman
named Suckey which she has now in her possession to her and her heirs & assigns forever.
Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth Jackson one negro named Charles to her and to her
heirs and assigns forever. Item I give to my daughter Sarah Claybrook two negroes to wit,
Beck and Lewis, one feather bed, one chest of furniture, one cow mare, bridle and Saddle
one harness all the year that belongs it, one collar and flay wheel to her and her heirs and
assigns forever. Item I give to my daughter Martha Calhoun one negro named Jerry and
ten pounds Current money of Virginia to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give
to my daughter Mary Bayce one negro named Balak to her and her heirs & assigns
forever. Item I lend to my daughter Franchey Johns three negroes to wit, Phillis, Jerry and
Stephen during her natural life and at her decease I give the said negroes and their increase
to be equally divided among her Children to them their heirs and assigns forever. I give

to my deceased daughter Anne Clark's four eldest Children to wit, Mary Fears, James
Fears, Richard Fears and Sally Fears, one hundred pounds current money of Virginia
to be equally divided amongst them as they come to age or marry to them and their
heirs and assigns forever. Item I certify of those negroes to wit, Dick, Lope, Bala, &
Jenny, Phillis, Beck, and Charles should die before the Legatee is possessed of them, it is my
Will that my executor shall pay Fifty pounds out of my estate to that Legatee or Legatees.
Item It is my Will that the remainder of my estate not heretofore Willed (at the
death of my Wife) be equally divided amongst all my Children to wit, Peter, Josiah,
Mary, Elizabeth, Sally, Martha, Anna and Franky, to them their heirs & assigns
forever. It is my Will that my estate should not be appraised. I constitute & appoint
my sons Peter Claybrook and Josiah Claybrook Executors to this my last Will and Testament.

 said Executor who made oath according to Law Certificate is granted them for obtain-
 ing a Probate of the said Will in due form they giving Security whereupon they
 with Joel Watkins their Security entered into and Acknowledged their bond according
 to Law for that purpose.
