

Page In the name of God amen I Page Mann of Charlotte County being sick and weak in
body but of a sound perfect mind and memory, blessed be God for the same, I do make
and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit,
First I bequeath to my beloved wife Patience Mann all my estate both real and personal to
enjoy the same during her natural life or widowhood — I then I give to my son,
Ezekiel Mann and his heirs forever after the death of my wife Patience Mann three negro
servants, York, Annis, and Patt also all my lands except two hundred and twenty acres
which I give to my Grand daughter Patience Boley and her heirs forever after the death
of my wife Patience Mann it being the two hundred and twenty acres by late Survey
purchased of James Loggins, also I give my Grand daughter Patience Boley two
negros after the death of my wife Patience Mann Abram and Loring — I then I bequeath
all my debts after all my lawful debts are paid that all my household and kitchen
furniture with all the plantation utensils and all the stock of horses, cattle, sheep &
hogs and after the death of my wife Patience Mann should be sold and the money
arising from such sale, after all my lawful debts is paid the balance of money
should be equally divided between Ezekiel Mann my son, my daughter Elizabeth
Daniel, and Patience Boley my Grand daughter — Lastly I do nominate &
constitute and appoint my friends John David and George Allen Tillet who
I do execute of this my last Will and Testament revoking and annulling

Daniel, and Patience Boley my Granddaughters - Lastly I do nominate &
Constitute and appoint my friends John Daniel and George Allin Sublet who
I Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament looking and knowing
all other heretofore made by me - In Witness whereof I the said Page have
hereunto set my hand and Seal this ~~seventh~~ day of June one thousand eight
hundred and two Page Allan L. J.

At a Court held for Charlotte County the 6th day of June 1803

This Last Will and Testament of Page Allan J. was presented in Court and the
same was proved by the oaths of John Chapfoll, James Broder and John W Michael
the three subscribing Witnesses and ordered to be recorded and John Daniel & George
A. Sublet the Executors named in this Will renounced in open Court the Burthen of
the Execution of the said Will - On the motion of Patience Allan the widow of the
said Page Allan who made oath according to Law Certificate is granted her for
obtaining letters of administration of the Estate with the will annexed she giving
Security, whereupon she with Chestley Boley and Benjamin Boley her Securities
entered into & acknowledged their bond according to Law for that purpose.
