Henry Curtis my Waggon and Team two Beds and furniture ten head of neat Cattle fifty
acres of land including the house Mr Clarkston now occupies ten head of hogs corn and meat
sufficient to supply his family as hereafter named for & during the space of one year from
My Will and desire is that my Slave Henry Curtis his wife Jonathan his Daughter Betty
now my house servant James and Henry his sons shall have their Freedom after my just
debts are paid I give in trust to my Brother Joseph Greenhill the negroes that I purchased at my
Brother Joseph Greenhills house of Joseph Mason Deputy Sheriff of Brunswick County
which will more fully appear by Reference being had to the Records of the said County Court likewise
one third of my ^{all} Estate real & personal which he may dispose to his Children as he thinks proper
and to them and their heirs forever I am I give in trust to my Brother Samuel Greenhill all
the residue of my Estate real & personal which he may dispose to his Children as he thinks
proper & to them and their heirs forever I do hereby appoint and constitute my Brothers
Joseph and Samuel Greenhill my Executors they to give no Security of this my last
Will and Testament wishing and desiring all debts heretofore made by me to be paid
my hand & Seal this ninth day of May 1793

At a Court held for Charlotte County the 1 day of December 1794

The last Will and Testament of Paschal Greenhill decd was exhibited in Court by Joseph Greenhill one of the Executors named and the same was proved by the oath of Benjamin Cook one of the Witnesses hereto Subscribed and at the same Court continued and held for the said County the day following the same was further proved by the oath of Williamson Price and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said Joseph Greenhill who made oath according to Law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form he giving Security whereupon he together with Samuel Greenhill & Philip Greenhill his Securities entered into and acknowledged bond according to Law for that purpose the said Samuel Greenhill having first renounced in open Court the burden of execution of the said Will
