word of God by which I have obtained this my last Will & Testament
in manner and form following To wit, I give and bequeath all the land
I hold lying on the Dutchman branches, to my niece, Jane Brecklow
also I give negroes (W^{ts}), Cooper, George, William, Hercules likewise my
Clock and some one bed & furniture, one third of the house hold and
kitchen furniture, Item I lend to my Sister Sarah Johnson
Brecklow one negro woman named Fannie, to wait upon her
during her life, and after her Death to be returned into the said
estate again out of which Estate my said Sister is comfortably
maintained during her life. Item I also give to Jane Brecklow one
horse & hunting saddle to her & her heirs forever. Item I lend to
Sally Almond the best of my land & negroes & house during her
life and after her decease to be equally divided among her children. Item
I lend to Sally Almond two thirds of my stock of Cattle, Hogs and Sheep
during her life and after her Death to be equally divided among all
her children. Item I bequeath to my

During her life, and after her Death to be partitioned into the said
estate agreed out of which Estate my said Sister Comfortably
maintained during her life. Item I also give to my said Brother one
horse & hunting saddle to her & her heirs forever. Item I lend to
Sally Almond the use of my land & negro house during her
life and after her decease to be equally divided among her children. Item
I lend to Sally Almond two thirds of my stock of Cattle, Hogs and Sheep
during her life and after her decease to be equally divided among all
her children. Item I also give to my said Brother the remainder part of
my stock of Cattle, Hogs & Sheep to her & her heirs forever. I do hereby
constitute & appoint my friends Thomas Patten and John Patten Jr
of Lanesburg Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness

revoking and Repealing all Wills heretofore made by me and
bequeath to my son William Bates all the Tract of Land which I own in
Lancashire to be about thirty acres more or less to him & to his heirs forever
All my other Estate such as my Stock of all kinds, household furniture
and every Species of my Property to be equally Divided among all
my Children except the Land before given to my son William, to him
