In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Moore Senior being weak in body
the of sound & perfect mind and memory make this my last Will and Testament in
manner following, I have unto my wife Elizabeth Margaret Moore, during her Natural
Life or Widow hood one half of the remainder of my tract of land including the
houses, Plantation after one hundred acres of the said land shall be taken out
which I hereafter give to my son George Moore, I also unto my said Wife
during her life or her Widowhood & the remainder of my Household & Kitchen
furniture, all my Stocks of Money be it all or part thereof I have hereunto signed
my hand and the hand of my wife Elizabeth Margaret Moore this 6th day of March 1797

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and after his decease I gave the whole furniture to be sold & the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between my three daughters Elizabeth, Martha, & Rachel Moore on the Anniversaries of them - I give unto my son George Moore the above mentioned one hundred acres of land to be his if adjoining the land of Robert Moore, George Walker & Alexander Buckley, to him the said George Moore his heirs or assigns forever - I give unto my son Samuel Moore the half of the remainder of my tract land to be immediately possessed by him & the half given to my Wife after the decease or marriage of my wife to him the said Samuel Moore his heirs or assigns forever. I also give to the said Samuel Moore a bed & furniture & all the debts due me - I give unto my daughter Jane Moore two young horses, that she for some time hath had in possession a bed & furniture & Cows & Calf. I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Moore a bed & furniture - I give unto my daughter Martha Moore a bed & furniture, I give unto my daughter Rachel Moore, a young bay horse a bed & furniture, & ten pounds cash - I give unto my daughter Mary Hunter, my sons John Moore, Robert Moore, & Thomas Moore five Shillings each. I appoint my son Samuel Moore & son in Law John Hunter Executors to this my last Will & testament making all others heretofore by me made & declaring this only to be my last Will & testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal this 17th day of September 1796

to join in the probate thereof when the Court shall think fit —
