

To the Name of you Men, I Samuel
Morton of Lunenburg County being in a weak state of health thought in
proper times to make this my Last will and Testament as follows I propose
and Bequeath of all my Estate as Followeth. Item I leave to my wife two
Induring her Natural Life named Ned and Phillis and also give
third part of my household goods as I Stock Horn Hyne and Bequeath
four Negroes Tom, Leant, Rachel & Milkey and three Indian to be Equally
Divided Betwixt my Children when my son William comes of age and
the two Negroes I have left to my wife and three Indian to be Equally
Divided Betwixt my Children after my wife Death and all the Remainder
of my Estate after my Debt is paid to them their heirs and assigns for
ever I Give and Bequeath to my son William the plantation which
I have with all the Land there on the South Side of Hill Creek to him
and assigns I have also I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter
one hundred acres of Land on the North Side of Hill Creek

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forever. Item I give and bequeath to the child that my wife is now
with all the remaining part of my Land on the North Side of Miller
Shem Morton's lines and the Land I give to my Daughter Mary to her
hus or her heirs or assigns forever and that if either two of my Sons
die before they come of age that their part of Land be Equally Divided
between these two Children I also constitute and appoint my wife George
Morton and William Morton Executors of this my Last will & Testament
I Revoke and Disannul all other Wills by me Formerly made and Do
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty first
day of February one thousand seven hundred and sixty four.
