To the said Child when it comes of age or married, I give & bequeath to the said Children

I bought of Saml. Parker

Tract of Land containing three hundred & forty acres to be divided into four equal parts

I brought of Sam'l Parker
Tract of Land containing Three hundred & Thirteen acres to the same manorship when the
said Child comes of age or Marriage I give and bequeath to the said Child one horse & Heddle
The Value of Twenty pounds current money of Virginia Three long Heddles one feather bed &
Furniture when the said Child comes of age or marriage, My Will & desire is that if the said
Child should die without lawful issue that all that I have given the said Child by equally
Divided between all my children then living. Also I give & bequeath to my son Robert Bedford
the Tract of Land wherein I now live to him and his heirs forever my Will & Desire is that my
loving wife Frances Bedford shall peaceably enjoy one third part of the land likewise during her
life and if it should happen that my son Robert and my loving wife Frances should disagree
and not be willing to live together then it is my Will & Desire that my son Robert should at
least to be Built
his own built & expense a Dwelling house and otherouthouse necessary for himself & Mother
agreed to her desire and if my son Robert shall refuse to provide such necessary building for
his Mother when by her required then my wife Frances is that my beloved wife shall peaceably
enjoy the house where I now live without the least inter option or hindrance of her or my son
Robert or any other person whatever during her life or my wife Frances in the same place

possession of my goods & chattels being Daughters bedding, Three Negroe men, Books,
Hid, & Tools, one horse & saddle of the value of Twenty Pounds, current money of Virginia three
Boys & two Girls and further bed & furniture to be divided among Daughters bedding whom of age or
married to her & her heirs forever. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Frances Bedford Three
Negroes named quiet Will, & little Will & Judd, and horses & furniture of the value of Twenty Pounds,
current money of Virginia and further bed & furniture, three Boys & two Girls who are now living
said Daughter Frances whom of age or married to her and heirs forever. And lastly my Will
& Desire is that after the Death of myself and wife all the movable Estate I have not left
away may be equally divided among my Children then living. — I do constestably
appoint my loving wife Frances Bedford, and my friend Sherwood Mallon, and my brother
Thomas Bedford, and my friends Joseph Passion to be Executors of this my last Will

Stephen Bedford, and my friends Joseph Pearson, Esq; & George H. Cramers, of this my last Will
I entreat Burying all former Wrongs by me made, As Witness my hand this fourth day of
in the year of our Lord
June One thousand seven hundred & twenty six, Stephen Bedford, S.S.

The above written last Will & Testament of Stephen Bedford and C was exhibited in Court by Francis
Bedford, Attorney of the County, the Executing Trustee of the Executors herein named & the
same was proved by the oaths of Robert Walton, Shrewsbury Pearson & John Sullivan & the three of them
were sworn to be the Act & Deed of the said Stephen Bedford and C & acknowledged Proved. Upon this
swearing of the said Executing Trustees whom I doth according to Law, Certifieate for obtaining
Probate of the said Will or any former granted them, they giving Security whereupon they
together with Matthew Murray, Thomas Loring, Jos. Town, James Mathews, their Security
entered into and Acknowledged the same according to law for that purpose, Reserving Liberty to
Joseph Pearson the other trustee herein named to join in the probate hereof when he shall think
fit.
