

In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Boulden of
 Charlotte County, of perfect sense and memory do make and constitute
 this my last Will and Testament to wit, first I order and direct that my
 Funeral expences and Just debts, be duly paid and discharged,
 2^{dly} I give and bequeath to my son James Boulden four hundred Acres of
 Land whereon he now lives to him and his heirs forever, also the sum of thirty
 pounds Current Money, to be raised from my estate, and paid him at the
 end of three years from my death. 3^{dly} I give and bequeath to my Daughter
 Harriena wife of John Cox the sum of fifty pounds Current Money, to be
 paid her at the end of three years from my death. 4^{thly} I give and bequeath
 to my son Thomas Boulden one Negro man slave named Jacob to him
 and his heirs forever also the sum of thirty pounds Current Money to be
 paid him at the end of three years from my death. 5^{thly} I give and bequeath to my
 son William Boulden three hundred and ninety acres of land on Little River
 in this County to him and his heirs forever, also one Negro man's slave named
 Pitt. also the sum of five pounds Current Money. 6^{thly} I give and bequeath
 to my son Joseph Boulden seven hundred and sixty acres of Land in Henric
 County, also one Negro man slave named Sam. also five pounds Current Money.
 7^{thly} I give and bequeath to The Children of my daughter Mary the sum of
 twenty pounds each to be paid them when they come of age or marry, and in the
 case of the death before that time the sum is to be paid to the 11th 8^{thly} I

case of the death before that time the money to be paid to the other. 8th I
order and direct that the remainder of my estate remain on the plantation
wherein I now live, and that the business of my plantation and other affairs
be carried on and Transacted as they now are, I also order that the money arising
from the sale of my lands, and all my other estate for every kind what ever
be equally divided between my two sons Wood & Richard Bouldins, to them
and their heirs forever, Lastly I constitute and appoint my said two sons
Wood and Richard to be my Executors. Charlotte May 1st 1777.

Signed, sealed, published and declared
by the Testator to be his last Will and Testament in presence of James
Cunninghame, Sarah Collier, Abraham ^{his} Vaughn, Ann ^{her} Vaughn, Robt Gellison
Thomas Cox.

At a Court held for Charlotte County the second day of June 1783.
This Last Will and Testament of Thomas Bouldin Senr. was Exhibited in Court
by Wood Bouldin & Richard Bouldin the Executors therein named and the
same was proved by the oaths of Sarah Collier, Abraham Vaughn, Anne Vaughn
and Thomas Cox, and ordered to be Recorded, On the Motion of the said
Executors who made oath according to law, Certificate is granted them for
obtaining a probate of the said Will, they giving security, whereupon they
together with the Reverend Thomas Johnston and Joseph Collier their
Securities entered into and Acknowledged their bond according to law for that
purpose.
