

T. Edenfield's
Nuncupative
Will

Who died the Last day of Dec. 1780, without Will or Writing
The last desire of Thomas Edenfield, before his decease was as follows That his Estate should
immediately be sold and all his Just debts paid and that Elizabeth Kinnel should be paid
Three hundred Pounds for the use of the Shop and many other services she had
done him, after this being done the remaining part of his money he desired should be Equally
divided between his two brothers and one sister living to the Northward, he also desired that
William Womack and John Brent should be his Executors.

A Court held for Charlotte County the fifth day of February 1781
The foregoing Nuncupative Will of Thomas Edenfield dec. was presented in Court by
William Womack one of the Executors named, and the same was proved by the Oaths
of Henry Barnes and William Brewer to be the words and will of the said Thomas
Edenfield, and ordered to be Recorded on the motions of the said Executor who made
Oath according to Law, Certificate is granted him for Obtaining a probate of the said
Will by giving Security, whereupon he together with William Hubbard his Security
entered in to and Acknowledge a their Bond for that purpose, and John Brent the
Other Executor named, Renounced in Court the Execution of said Will
