do make and ordain this my last will and Testament (viz) Here I give and bequath to my
son Thomas North the following negroes Abram, Sarah, Lewis, Peg, & give to him & his heirs forever
Here I give & bequath to my son Anthony North one Negroe man Ambrose and one Negroe man
named Stephen to him and his heirs forever, and consideration of the above legacy Anthony North
shall pay twenty five pounds Virginia currency toward discharging my just debts Here I give
and bequath to my daughter Susanna Cox the following negroes Jure Charles & Jude to her & her heirs
forever Here I give and bequath to my grandson James North one Negroe woman Luce & one child
Alley to him and his heirs forever Here I give & bequath to my grand daughter Polly North one
negroe Dinah to her & her heirs forever Here I give & bequath to my grand daughter Polly one negroe
named Honor to her & her heirs forever Here I give and bequath to my grand daughter Frances North
one negroe named Aggy to her & her heirs forever Here I lend to Frances Dodson during her natural
life one negroe woman named Cloe & at her death Cloe & her hereafter increase to return to my grand
children above named Here I give and bequath to my son William North one negroe woman named
old Bett & one negroe boy named George to him & his heirs forever Here I give & bequath to my son Richard
North one negroe woman named great Bett & one negroe man named Cuff to him and his heirs forever
Here I give & bequath to my son Abram North one negroe ^{named} Jack & one named Sall to him &
his heirs forever Here I give & bequath to my son Reuben North one negroe named Sue & one named
Tom to him & his heirs forever Here I lend to Elizabeth Loe during her natural life one negroe
and one named Luce and at her death Luce to go to her son Gilber Loe, Here I give to Elizabeth

Item to him & heirs forever. Item I lend to Elizabeth Loe during her natural life one negro
and one named Luce and at her death Luce to go to her son Gilber Loe, Item I give to Elizabeth
Loe one feather bed & furniture to her & her heirs forever, Item my well desire is that my
land & plantation with my stocks of horses cattle & hogs household & kitchen Furniture plantation
utensals &c shall be sold to discharge my just debts If there should be a balance left after paying
my just debts I desire it may be divided between my sons William, Richard, Abram &
Reuben Item I do appoint my friend Francis Thornton and my son Thomas North
my Exors of this my last Will & Testament as my hand & seal this 16th day of December 1793

with Charles McHenry William Marshall Thomas North and William Smith
the security entered into and acknowledged their bond according to law for that purpose and the
said Thomas North acknowledged in open Court the truth of execution of the said
