But if it should please God that any of my Children should depart this Life, without leaving any Issue, then their part of my Estate to be put in with the rest I lent to my wife, and it is my Will and desire, that when it should please God that my Wife should depart this Life, that my Whole Estate be Equally divided among all my Children.
