

In the name of God amen I William Marshall of Charlotte County being weak in
body but sound in sense and memory thanks to almighty God for the same calling
to mind the uncertainty of this life do make and Ordain this my Last Will & Testament
revoking all other Wills heretofore made by me. and as for what worldly Estate it
has pleased God to bestow on me I give and bequeath in the following manner to-wit
I give I lend to my daughter Polly Spencer for her use during her natural life one
negro girl named Hannah with all her increase and fifty pounds Cash to be paid
by at the discretion of my Executors as she may need it and at her death the above
left legacy to be equally divided amongst her children — I then I give and bequeath
to my daughter Suckey Pitt one negro woman named Ester, one negro child named
Virginia to her and her heirs forever — I then I give and bequeath of son John Marshall
one bay horse named Pocket to him and his heirs forever — I then I give and bequeath to
my daughter Wenna Marshall one negro girl named Chira one good horse, one
feather bed and furniture one hundred dollars Cash and that she shall be maintained
out of my Estate as heretofore until married to her and her heirs forever — I then I
give and bequeath to my sons William, Benjamin, Beverly and Samuel Marshall as
they may come of age one horse saddle and bridle each to them and their heirs forever
I then I lend to my loving wife Elizabeth Marshall during her natural life or widow
hood the residue of my Estate and ~~my~~ personal that has not heretofore been devised
and at her death my Will is that the Estate I have lent to my Wife shall be equally

divided between my five Sons viz. John, William, Benjamin, Beverly and Samuel
Marshall and their heirs forever. Then I do nominate and appoint my loving Wife
Elizabeth Marshall, my Son John Marshall, my Brother Benjamin Marshall &
my friend Joshua Wholley my Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. Witness
my hand & seal this 6th day of June 1805 W^m Marshall

At a Court held for Charlotte County the 2^d day of September 1805

This Last Will and Testament of William Marshall dec^d was presented in Court by Elizabeth
Marshall, John Marshall and Benjamin Marshall the Executors and two of the executors
herein named and the same was proved by the oath of Francis Thorton & Richard
Davenport two of the Witnesses hereto subscribed to be acknowledged by the said William
Marshall as his Last Will and Testament in their presence & aided to be Read.
On the motion of the said Executors and executors who made oaths according to Law Certifi-
cate is granted them for obtaining a probate of the said Will in due form they giving
Security whereupon they with Richard Davenport & Francis Thorton their Sureties
entered into & acknowledged their Obedience to Law for that purpose - reserving
liberty to Joshua Wholley the other executor herein named to join in the probate thereof
when he shall think fit
