 will of William Warrack of Charlotte County Dec<sup>d</sup> who departed this life the  
 above date within who appeared to be in his proper senses & Call on us whose names are  
 under written to take notice that by the said William Warrack did give to Elizabeth  
 Jackson wife of Simon Jackson one certain negre woman known by the name of Alley  
 and her increase during her life and at her death to be disposed of by the said Elizabeth  
 Jackson as she might think proper and the said Warrack Call on us to take notice that  
 was his desire that Simon Jackson <sup>should</sup> take charge of the plantation which <sup>are</sup> then <sup>in</sup> <sup>the</sup> <sup>land</sup>  
 and every thing thereon and to keep them together until he made a crop for the ensuing  
 year as witness each of our hands the above date written
