This Indenture made this 5th day of August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and thirty between Thomas Haynes Jun^r of North Carolina of the one part and John Stith of Charles City County in Virg^a of the other part
Witnesseth that for an in Consideration of the Sum of Forty pounds Currant money to him the Said Haynes in hand paid by the Said Stith the rec^t whereof he doth hereby acknowledge he the Said Haynes doth grant bargain and sell unto the Said Stith his heirs & assigns for ever one certain parcel or Tract of Land lying & being in the County of Charles City, and on the upper side of Trindades Creek being the plantation William Inby now lives on and containing one hundred & twenty five acres according to its ancient bounds as it was bought of Nicholas Haynes Dec'd of Thomas Cowles Gent. **To have & to hold** the Said Mesuage and Tenement with all and Singular it's Appurtenances thereunto belonging to him the S^d Stith his heirs & assigns for ever and Lastly the Said Haynes doth for himselfe his heirs Executors & adm^rs for ever warrant and defend the Said Land with all and Singular the appurtenances thereunto belonging unto him the Said Stith his heirs and assigns for ever
