life and after her Decease to my daughter Franc. Smith and her heirs for ever

Item — I give and bequeath unto my son Edward Gibson my Negro woman Judy to him
and his heirs for ever And also I give unto my son Edward all my wearing Coats
and Carpenters Tools and Coopers Tools

Item — I give unto George Smith our God Two Sheets Two Blankets and a Rug:

Item — I give and bequeath unto Tabitha Nollin my negro girl Nanny to her and her
heirs for ever

my Will and Desire is that George Smith shall take Care of my Negroes of both
and that they shall be Equally Divided between my wife and my Granddaughter
or Sarah Smith:
