- Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Ann Johnson Two pewter
Dishes & three pewter basons & one pewter Tawbard & my best bed
& furniture and a gold Ring with a Josie / This You see remember me
& a Silver bodkin & my brass Kettle
- All which I desire my Loving friends Charles Emery & his
wife to take in possession with my Daughter Mary Ann
and to have the Tutition of her until she comes to the aforesaid
age and that he put her Schoole three Years and to pay for her
Schooling out of the Money the remainder of my Estate is to be
Sold for by my Executors
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter above all the remainder
of my Estate after my Just debts & Legacys be paid to be paid
unto her by my Executors when she arrives to Sixteen Year
of age or Married
- Lastly I doe hereby make constitute and appoint my Loving Friends
John West & Robert Daniel to be whole & sole Executors of
