and a Sheet Two Sows a gun & four peaster Dishes Two Deep & two flat
and six pewter plates and one Large Chest, and a paddle Tumbler, I further

To other bed Bolster and the Covering to it belonging and a large
Chest, but it is my will and desire that my Son Thomas may not take
the bed and Chest from his Mother during his Natural life —
Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Whittle wife to John Whittle
One Cow and Calf and Two Sons. Item I give and bequeath unto my
Daughter Judith one Cow and Calf and Two Sons. Item I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Sarah one Cow and Calf and a Bick of Robert
