 my heirs Ex^{rs} and assigns and will warrant and for ever defend
 the said Hundred and twenty acres of Land unto the said Ambrose
 Day and to his heirs for ever from the Claim of me my heirs
 Ex^{rs} and assigns and from any other person or persons whatsoever
 In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 Seal this Twenty first Day of October in y^e Year of our Lord 1730
 One Thousand seven Hundred and Twenty Eight

 Ordain and appoynt this to be my last will and Testament in
 manner as followeth In primis I bequeath my Soul into the
 hands of Almighty God my heavenly redeemer trusting in his
 merits to have full Pardon and all my manifold Sins & Iniquities
 and I bequeath my body to the earth to be decently buried at the
 Discretion of my Decemrix hereafter named

I give and bequeath unto my Son John Rogers all my land that I am
 possessed withall to him and to his heirs forever and I give to my Sⁿ
 John John Two Cows & two Sows, one Iron pot one Iron skillet, &
 a gun, Item, I give and bequeath unto my Son Henry Rogers Two Cows
 & Calves or Cows with Calves and a Hoar of two years old and one Iron
 pot of four gallons, one feather & bolster with a rug and a blanket
 and a sheet Two Sows again & four pewter Dishes two deep & two flat
 and six pewter plates and one Large Chest, and a pottle Tumbler, I bequeath

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 further remember to give to my Son John one mare with foal and
 Toather had Bolsters and the Covering to it belonging and a large
 Chest, but it is my will and desire that my Son John may not take
 the bed and Chest from his Mother, during his Natural life
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann White wife to John White
 one Cow and Calfo and Two Sows. Item I give and bequeath unto my
 Daughter Judith one Cow and Calfo and Two Sows. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my Daughter Sarah one Cow and Calfo and a Bill of Robert
 Greens of fine and twenty Shillings Cash
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Anna Coley wife of Thomas
 Coley one Shilling she having before received her portion
 Item I give unto my Grandson William Coley one Cow Calfo
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving wife all the remaining part
 of my Estate being in what nature kind or quality after all my Just
 Debts and Legacies payd and Satisfied and Lastly I Ordain and appoint
 my Loving wife Elisabeth Rogers to be my full and sole Executrix
 of this my last will and Testament and in Testimony of the same
 I hereunto Set my hand and fix my Seal this fourth day of April
 in the Year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven hundred and
 thirty:
