

In the Name of God Amen Robert Lido of Wilmington Parish in Charles City County being very sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect Sense of memory doth make and Ordain this to be his last Will and Testament: in manner and form following:

Item I give & bequeath unto my Loving wife Elizabeth Lido two Negroes by Name Peter and Jenny during her life or as long as she shall Continue a widow and after her death or Marriage I give the two Negroes as aforesaid Peter to my Loving son John Lido and Jenny to my Loving Daughter Sarah Lido wife to Jos. Wad. I likewise give my wife as aforesaid two feather beds & furniture four leather Chairs three Cows with Calves by their sides a mare and two saddle Jenns hogs three putted Dishes six plates my intent and meaning is that my wife is to have the two Negroes no longer than she Remains a widow

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving son John Lido all my Land and Plantations lying and being in Charles City County with the Appoint: on names thereto belonging Except forty Acres of Land I shall hereafter bequeath to my Daughter Sarah I also give my Son six Negroes by Name Jo. Nanny. Will. Deft. Hannah & Canney with their increase

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah wife to Jos. Wad. forty Acres of Land more or less lying and being in Charles City County and coming to the Plantation Jos. Wad. now lots and my Will and Desire is it may be laid out without any Charge of Survey by my son John Lido as he knew I allways intended it for his sister Sarah and further my intent and meaning is that my Daughter Sarah Wad. have the increase of Negro Jenny I have before bequeathed her:

Item all the Remainder of my Estate of what Nature or Quality so ever I give unto my son John Lido as likewise I name Constitutor and appoint my son John whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament absolutely Revoking and making Null and Void all Wills & Testaments by me made or declared by word or writ and do Ordain this to be my last Will & Testament as WITNESSE my hand sealed this 26th day of July 1726
