pounds Currant money of Virginia
- I Give and bequeath unto Martha Watkins widow Two pounds Ten
Shillings Currant money of Virginia
- I Give and bequeath unto Mary Brewer widow of John Brewer
five pounds Currant money of Virginia

Carried Over

- Item I give and Bequeath unto my Godson the son of John and Mary Brewer twenty Shillings Currant money of Virginia to be paid to a School Master when it becomes due for schooling of him.
- Item I give and bequeath unto Robert Sandford the Iron pott I lent him and my Silver Buckles and my Two Gunns and sword.
- Item I Give and bequeath unto Edward Jackson all my wearing Coats and to his now wife twenty Shillings Currant money of Virginia and a small gold Ring.
- Item I Give and bequeath unto John Eloe the son of John and Rebecca Eloe One Negro boy named Isaac to him and his heires for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath unto Sibbella Eloe the Daughter of John and Rebecca Eloe One Negro girl Named Nanne to her and her heires for ever.
- Item I give and bequeath unto Rebecca Hubbard Eloe the Daughter of John and Rebecca Eloe One Negro girl named Sarah to her and her heires for ever.
- Item I Give and bequeath unto Sibbella Eloe and her Sister Rebecca Hubbard Eloe as above mentioned all the increase of Children as my Negro woman Betty shall bring from this time forward to be Equally Divided between them and their heires for ever.
