Mary Shack one cow with half calf & Blebsom & likewise the use of the  
Stock untill the children come of age Item I give to my Daughter Charach Twenty  
shillings Lastly I give to my wife Mary Shack the remainder of my Estate  
be it what it will, Whom I constitute Executor of this my last will & Testament

seven hundred and sixty nine Between John Bell of Charles City County of the one part and  
Isaac Woodcock of the same County of the other part Witnesseth that the said John Bell for  
and in consideration of the Rents and other Covenants herein mentioned do demise grant  
and farm unto the said Isaac Woodcock a parcel of Land containing fifty Acres more or  
less bounded as follows beginning at a Red Oak in a black mark'd from thence about  
east fourne to a pine mark'd from thence down the Road to Richard Pugh's line  
from thence along his line to a red Oak from thence about west fourne to the red Oak begun  
at To have and to hold the said granted premises and every part thereof together with  
all and singular the houses, Orchards, Fields, Woods, & Waters unto the said Isaac  
Woodcock his heirs &c from the first day of November next unto the full end of Term of  
Twenty one years next coming To have the above said parcel of Land the first four  
teen years to build the said John Bell a house 24 feet long & 16 feet wide with two
