 my last will & Testament in manner and form as followeth; Item I give to
 my son Richard Gilliam one Shilling Sterling money of Great Britain Item I give
 to my Daughter Ann Gilliam the use of the Plantation whereon Francis Drake now
 Town containing Sixty Acres during the Time she lives unmarried and after
 her Marriage or death I give the said Land to my son Jeffrey Gilliam to him and
 his heirs forever. I also give unto my said son Jeffrey Gilliam the Land &
 Plantation whereon I now live together with the heq and furniture Thereon four
 Ruston Plates One Iron foot to him His heirs forever. Item My will & Desire
 is that all the rest of my estate of what kind soever be sold to the highest bidders
 and the money arising therefrom to be equally Divided between my four
 Children Viz; Richard Gilliam, Ann Gilliam Judith Drake & Mary Gilliam to them
 & their heirs Lastly I nominate & appoint my son Jeffrey Gilliam my whole & sole
 Executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have written
