County being sick in body but in perfect mind and memory blessed
bigod forth. I do make and ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament in manner and form as followeth that is to say first &
principally I commend my soul into the hands of God that gave it
and my body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be interred
at the direction of my Execution hereafter named and as for such
worldly Goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and
dispose of as followeth. Item my will is that all my Just Debts and
funeral charges be paid and discharged. Item I give and bequeath
unto my son John Holt my negro girl named Sue and her increase
to the said John Holt and his heirs forever and Ten pence. Item I give
and bequeath unto my son Joseph Holt forty pounds Cash to be
paid within two years after my decease. Item I give unto my
son Nicholas Holt sixty pounds Cash to be paid within two years
after my decease. Item I leave my two Negroes Harry & Frank
to be sold to help to pay my Just Debts with as much of my personal
estate as will discharge them. Item I give and bequeath to
my son Thomas Holt my Negroes as followeth ^{my} Melation man Ned
& Marmy & Lyday & Terax & Jack & Temme and their increase and
Lastly when all my debts and Legacies is paid I give all the
remainder of all my estate to my son Thomas Holt and his
heirs forever and do constitute and appoint my son Thomas
Holt and William Gregory to be my sole & sole Executors of this
my last will and testament Revoking and annulling all
other wills made by me, and this only to be my last Will and
Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this 20th of October One thousand seven hundred and
sixty five
