I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Rebekah, four Negroes to wit
Dick, Gory, Jimmy, & Moll during her Natural Life and after her
decease my will and desire is that my Nephew Hardyman Daney
may have the above mentioned Negroes to him and his heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath unto my said Nephew Hardyman Daney
one Negro or mulatto Boy called Watt immediately after my
Death to him and his heirs forever

Item I lend my Land whereon I now live to my loving wife, except
Fifty acres over the road where my Nephew Hardyman Daney
now lives on, during her Natural Life and I also lend her all
my personal Estate during her Natural Life (except Ten hogs
living on the Creek near Thomas Spraggins also two cows and
calves and two Sheep) and after her decease, to be sold and the
money arising from such sale I give to my Nephew Hardyman
Daney as also the above excepted Hogs cattle & Sheep to him &
his heirs forever

Item I give the afore said Fifty acres of Land over the Road where my
said Nephew Hardyman Daney now lives on to be enjoyed
by him immediately after my Death to him and his heirs for
ever

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife a small black

With horse called Yeak and two Bedd Furniture, two iron pots and a dozen
and half a dozen Rush bottom chairs, two pewter dishes, two basins, half
a dozen plates and notable and every other thing she possessed when I
married her, to her and her heirs forever

And I constitute and appoint the said Hardyman Dancy Executor of this
my Last Will and Testament, redocking all Will by me heretofore made.
