In the Name of God Amen I Benjamin Daney of Charles City County and
Parish of Westover being very sick but of sound mind and memory, thanks be to
god for the same, and calling to mind that all men must die, do make this present
Writing my last Will and Testament, my soul I recommend to almighty God
my body I desire maybe decently interred by my Exors hereafter named,
and as to my Estate that it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath
in manner and form following,

I give and bequeath unto my loving brother Edward Daney during his
Natural life, A Negro man named Frank, and after his death I give
thesaid Frank to my Nephew Benjamin Daney of this County, to him and
his heirs forever

I give and bequeath to Samuel Maccran thirty eight pounds twelve
shillings current money of Virginia, together with the Interest arising
thereon, to him and his heirs forever, and my will and desire is that
immediately after my death that my Executors deliver up to the said
Samuel Maccran or his heirs, as pay ment of the above sum, the Mortgage
made to me by the said Samuel Maccran as Security for the said sum
above mentioned, which mortgage contains, one hundred and fifty six
acres of Land lying on Turnip Creek, in Charlotte County and was
Recorded in the said County Court the fifth day of December One thousand
Seven hundred and sixty nine

I give and bequeath unto Sackville Brewer Twenty five pounds
current money of Virginia to him and his heirs forever, provided
thesaid Brewer is living at my death, but if it should so happen that
he should depart this life before I do then I give the said Twenty five pounds
to my Nephew William Daney of this County to him and his heirs forever;
but if it should happen that the said William Daney should depart this
life before I do, then I give the said Twenty five pounds to his brother John
Daney to him and his heirs forever
