Item all the remainder of my estate I leave in the possession of Elizabeth Furgua my wife for and during her natural life and after my wife's decease and debts paid my will is that then what is left of my estate be equally divided amongst my children. That is to say my four sons John, Giles, William and Joseph and my three daughters Hannah, Elizabeth and Dianah.
