him to be my last Will and Testament that is to say first I commend my  
soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I commend  
to the Earth to be buried in Christian like manner at the discretion of my  
executors hereafter mentioned and for my worldly estate give in the  
following manner and form I beseech his grace to have in the power of  
Elizabeth my wife the Land & plantation wherein I now dwelt for and


during her Natural Life and after my wife's decease I give it to my son Samuel Tongue and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son William Tongue two sheep. Item I give and bequeath to my son John Tongue one sheep. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Joseph Tongue my own hunting gun. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah Rock one feather bed & boulster, with one rugg and a pair blankets. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Johnson one feather bed and furniture which I had sent her I now give it to her.

Item all the remainder of my estate I leave in the possession of Elizabeth Tongue my wife for and during her natural life and after my wife's decease and debts paid my will is —

that then what is left of my estate be equally divided amongst my children that is to say my four sons John, Giles, William and Joseph and my three daughters Hannah, Elizabeth and Diana. Item I make and ordain my wife Elizabeth my Executor and my son Giles my Executor and I do hereby utterly revoke and disannul all and every other former Will and bequeath whatsoever, whatsoever, confirming this and no other to be my Last and Testament and in witness according to the true tenor and meaning I set my hand and seal the day and date above written
