In the name of God amen Isaac Smith of Charles City County and Parish of Westover being very sick and weak of body but of Perfect mind thanks be to God calling to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say Principally and first I commend my Soul to God and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner As to my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to lend me I leave in the following manner Item first of all my Just Debts and funeral Charges are to be paid and all the residue now I lend to my beloved wife Martha Smith during her Natural life and after her death to be equally divided between my beloved Children Mary, William, John & Martha and I do nominate constitute and appoint my beloved wife Martha Smith and John Emory my Executor I likewise revoke & disannul all other wills by me made, Witness my hand this Eleventh day of September one thousand seven hundred & Sixty eight
