In the Name of God Amen I James Thompson of Charles City County being weak in body but in perfect sense and Memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same and my Soul I recommend unto the hands of Almighty God who gave it me and my body to be buried in a Christianlike manner and as to what worldly Estate it hath been pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner and form following.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Thompson my Negro boy named Mingo one feather Bed and furniture my Cotton and Wool Slaves & Harneis one book the whole Duty of Man and the sum of Forty five pounds current Money of Virginia to her and her Heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my son Harmon Thompson all my wearing Apparel — I give and bequeath unto my son James Thompson my large Bible — I give and bequeath unto my son in law William Emory my Negro Woman Doll to him and his Heirs forever further my will and desire is that all the Rest of my Estate both Real and personal be sold and the Money arising therefrom after paying all my just Debts and Legacy to my Daughter Sarah Thompson be equally Divided amongst the rest of my Children to wit, Harmon, Mary, James, Elizabeth, Martha, Thomas, Ruth and George — I Constitute and appoint my Friends Thomas Ballars, Freeman Walker and James Bullisant my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, Revoking and disannulling all other Wills that have been

heretofore made as Witness my Hand and Seal this 29th day of March 1773
