 my son Richard William one Shilling Sterling money of Great Britain Item I give
 to my Daughter Ann William the use of the Plantation whereon Francis Drake now
 lives containing Sixty Acres during the Time she lives unmarried and after
 her Marriage or death I give the said Land to my son Jeffrey William to him and
 his heirs forever. I also give unto my said son Jeffrey William the Land &
 Plantation whereon I now live together with the heq and furniture Thereon four
 Ruston Plates one Iron foot to him His heirs forever. Item My will & Desire
 is that all the rest of my estate of what kind soever be sold to the highest bidders
 and the money arising therefrom to be equally Divided between my four
 Children Viz; Richard William, Ann William Judith Drake & Mary William to them
 & their heirs Lastly I nominate & appoint my son Jeffrey William my whole & sole
 Executor of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have written

This Indenture made the 24th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & Sixty eight Between Littlebury Cooke of Charles City County of the one part & Rebecca Cooke his daughter of the other part Witnesseth that the said Littlebury for and in consideration of the Fatherly love and Affection which he beareth unto the said Rebecca his daughter and for her Advancement and Improvement in life and for the Consideration after Mother relinquishing her Right of Dower in the Mill Pond Plantation at Scares bridge hath given granted conveyed and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant conveyance confirm unto the said Rebecca Cooke her heirs and assigns the six following Slaves to wit, Pett Patt, Rachel, Tom, Laga, & Will with the increase of the said Females To have and to hold the said Slaves to the said Rebecca and her heirs to the use and behoof of the said Littlebury and Rebecca Hubbard his wife for and During their Joint lives and the life of the survivor and after their deaths to the said Rebecca and her heirs forever But in Case the said Rebecca Cooke should die under the age of Twenty one Years or unmarried then the said Slaves and their increase to remain to the said Littlebury Cooke his heirs & assigns forever In witness whereof the parties above said have hereunto interchangedably set their hands & Seals the day and year above said
