pertaining but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the almighty power of God, and as touching such worldly
estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give
Devise and dispose of the same in manner and form following
Item I give and bequeath to my son William Bollison Dunkard my
bed and all the furniture belonging to it and the three Shotes that is
now up in a pen by the house

Item I give unto my daughter Elizabeth Brewer all my wearing
clothes except one English Wearing Gown and that I give to my
daughter Mary Brewer

Item I give and bequeath to my son William Thompson all the
Remainder part of my stock & household stuff excepting my best iron
pott I give to my granddaughter Molly Thompson and one pewter basin
I give to my granddaughter Ellenor Thompson, and the remainder
of my household stuff aforesaid with the Crop of Corn and Tobacco and what
ever else growing upon the plantation, paying all my Just Debts I give

unto my son William Thompson aforesaid making him my son
