

Die or any other unlawful game he shall not play whereby his said Master may have Damage. with his own goods nor the goods of Others, without Licence from his Master, he shall not buy nor sell. He shall not absent himself Day or night from his said Master's service, without his leave nor haunt Alehouses, Taverns, or Playhouses, but in all things behave himself as a faithful Apprentice ought to do during the said Term, and the said Master shall use the utmost of his Endeavours to teach, or cause to be taught, or instructed, the said Apprentice in the Trade or Mystery of a Bricklayer and procure or provide for him sufficient Meat, Drink, Clothes Washing and Loozing getting for an Apprentice during the said Term of of Two years and for the true Performance of all and singular the Covenant and Agreements aforesaid, the Parties bind themselves each unto the other firmly by these presents. In Witness whereof the said Parties have interchangeably set their hands & Seals herewith.

In the name of God Amen I John Tuglar of Charles City County being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory I make and Ordain constitute & appoint this to be my last Will & Testament my Soul I recommend to the Almighty who gave it me, trusting through the Merit of my blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ from all my Sins my body I commit to the Earth to be interred at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and as to my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose of them in the following manner

It is my will and desire is that all my Just Ditts be paid Here I give and bequeath to my loving wife Sarah Tuglar the following Negroes for and during her natural life (to wit) Juwara Dick

 raised by her sale to be applied toward the payment of my debts)
 Hogs and sheep and also the corn and fodder with all the plantation
 utensils the paying of all legacies hereafter mentioned
 Item I give unto Lucy Partin forty shillings current money
 Annuum during her life to be paid by my wife so long as the
 Estate remains in her hands and after her death to be paid
 by those to whom the Estate falls after her death

Item after the death of my loving wife, I desire that my
 Estate may be equally divided between my Nephew John
 Fuglar son of Richard Fuglar and my Nephew Richard
 Fuglar son of Henry Fuglar and in case either dies before they
 arrive to the age of twenty one years the surviving one to have
 the whole but in case of the death of both my Nephews John &
 Richard Fuglar before they marry and leave heirs or arrive
 to Twenty one years of age then I desire the Estate to be equally
 divided between the children of my Sister Mary Brown and
 their heirs forever

Item I give unto Lucy Brown daughter of my Sister Mary Brown
 Twenty pounds current money to her & her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Wyatt Partin daughter of
 my Sister Lucy Partin twenty pounds current money to her and
 her heirs forever

Item I give unto Solomon Young son of Lucy Young Thirty One
 pounds current money to him and his heirs forever

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my loving wife
 Sarah Fuglar Executrix and my friend Hilbard Wyatt
 Esq of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all
 former wills by me in age. Resaining this only to be my last

This Indenture made the twelfth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine Between The Honourable William Byrre of Westover Esq. of the one part and Mess^{rs} Joseph Farrall & William Jones of the City of Bristol in the Kingdom of Great Britain Merchants & Partners of the other part Whereas the said William Byrre Esquire on the day of the date of these presents is and standeth justly indebted unto the said Mess^{rs} Farrall & Jones in the sum of Five thousand five hundred and sixty one pounds six shillings Sterling and for the better securing the payment thereof together with Lawfull Interest thereof from the date hereof the said William Byrre Esquire hath agreed to mortgage one hundred and fifty nine Slaves unto the said Farrall & Jones Now this Indenture witnesseth that the said William Byrre Esq. as well to secure the payment of the above said Five thousand five hundred and sixty one pounds six shillings Sterling with Interest thereon as for and in Consideration of the sum of Five shillings like money hath granted bargained sold and by these presents both grant bargain & sell unto the said Mess^{rs} Farrall and Jones one hundred and fifty nine slaves being now on the Plantations of Westover & Buckland in Charles City County whose names are as followeth Viz. Jack. Robt. Wate. Winnie, & Johnny. Ben. Tom. Daniel. Cesar. & Jack. Ne. Michael, & Willy Buck. Mosert Dick. Jacob Aaron Boom. Tom. Nick. George. Michael. James, Phil, Jack Page, Abraham Little Jimmy, Johnny. Andrew. Billy & Jack. Davis, Geo. Charles. Charles. Lucy & Nanny. Jenny. Beck. Fanny & Peggy. Maria. Nancy. Natty, Jenny Harris, Great Aggy, Little Aggy, Statia, Kate, Betty, Anky, Phaty & Rachel, Mulatto Thomy, Jenny Shum, Michael

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
