various I wish to obtain a lawful redemption, as to my worldly Estate in manner following Viz^o

I give and devise unto my loving wife Susanna Hardyman the house and plantation where I now live, except as much as is sufficient to work the slaves that will be left on it for the support of the family until my son Littlebury shall come to the age of twenty one years, at which time my desire is that my wife may have the one half of the aforesaid house and on other of the said and aforesaid during her Natural Life

Item I give unto my wife for her life half the household furniture. my will and desire is that my Lots & houses in the Town of Petersburg and County of Dinwiddie, and all the Lands purchased of William Kennons may be sold by my Executors or the survivors of them for the best price that can be got for the same and the money arising from such Sale I desire may be applied to the payment of all my Just Debts and if there should be more that sufficient to discharge my ~~debts~~ debts aforementioned

I give and devise a fourth part of the surplus to my loving wife and the rest to be equally divided between my three daughters, Susanna Stith Hardyman, Frances & Lucy Hardyman to them forever

Item I give and devise unto my daughter Susanna Stith Hardyman three Negro Girls to wit. Becky, Kate & Grace and their increase to her and her heirs forever and also one feather bed & furniture one day mare calld and known by the name of Bonny lass, the saddle she now rides, a Chest of Drawers, a Bureau, Looking Glass half a dozen napkins a set of China, a Tea Chest & Tea board to her & her heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to my said daughter Susanna, the spinch she now plays on to her & her heirs forever

Item I give and devise to my daughter Frances Hardyman three Negro Girls to wit. Sally, Jenny & Nancy to her and her heirs forever also one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever

Item I give to my daughter Lucy Hardyman three Negro Girls to wit, Betty, Lucy & Isabelle and also one feather bed & furniture to her and her heirs forever

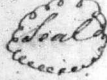
Item I give and devise unto my son Littlebury Hardyman two thirds of my land when he arrives to the age of twenty one years whereon I now live and after the death of my wife I give the other third of

my said land to him and his heirs forever. Likewise give unto my said son
 two Negroes to wit Henry Hunt and abey named Solomons, and the other moiety
 of my household furniture to him and his heirs forever. B
 Item I desire that all my estate of Negroes except what is before divided
 may be kept together on the said Island and improved, and out of the
 profits resulting therefrom my desire is that my loving wife and
 children aforesaid may be maintained as gently as the aforesaid
 profits will admit of, allowing at the same time sufficient to Educate
 my said son & daughters. I desire also that all my houses may be sold
 except what are given away in this will and except so many as are
 and may be sufficient for the use of the plantation. I desire that
 when either of my daughters shall marry or come to lawful age
 that all the Rest and residue of my estate as they shall marry or come
 of age respectively may be so apportioned as for either that marry first
 to have one third part to her and her heirs forever, or as they come of
 age to be apportioned in the same manner as above and the other parts
 of the Estate to remain as before mentioned for the purposes before men-
 tioned, and my desire is that neither of my children shall enjoy any
 more than a maintenance out of my estate undisposed of but what is
 before divided to each of them to take effect immediately, untill they
 do intitle themselves to their several portions as is aforesaid mentioned.
 Item I will and desire that whatever profits may be resulting more than
 sufficient out of the said estate while kept together, to gently main-
 tain my wife and children and to Educate my son, and daughters as
 their several situations require, may be equally divided between
 my wife and all my children as aforesaid to them & their heirs forever.
 Item I bequeath unto my trusty and well beloved Friend William
 Green Munford a year old boy now called and known by the name
 of Maney Dawson, daughter of Betty White to him forever.
 Item I desire that my carriages may be kept up for the use of the family
 and my wife during her life. I desire that all my stock of cattle, hogs
 and sheep may likewise be kept upon the plantation for the benefit of
 the family, and when my daughters shall marry or come of age, I
 desire that they or either of em marrying or coming of age as above-
 mentioned may have an equal part of all the stock aforesaid with
 my wife except the working oxen which are to be and remain on
 the plantation with the cart and utensils for the use of the family
 untill my son comes of age at which time I desire that the cart
 and oxen aforesaid may be for the use of him and my wife.

during her life and after her death to my son forever
 Item I desire that if either of my daughters die before marrying
 or coming of age or if my son should die before he comes to days full
 age, then all the Estate before given to either of them shall survive
 equally to all my children that shall both be living, and that
 all the money arising from the sales of my houses, all my outstanding
 debts, after a clear discharge of all my debts, shall be equally
 divided between all my children and wife before mentioned
 to each of them forever

And lastly I do nominate, constitute and appoint my loving
