In the Name of God Amen, I Robert Morgan of
Charles City County being very sick and weak of Body, but
of present sense and sound memory, Thanks be to God, and
calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to die, do
hereby make, ordain constitute and appoint, this my last Will
and Testament, in order to Dispose of all what Worldly goods
and Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with, and I desire
it may be received by all as such, and I give all the same in
the following manner

Impremis, I give and Bequeath to my son Robert Morgan
The Land and Plantation, whereon I now live, to him and his
Heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Savannah Morgan, that feather
Bed whereon she usually lies, Together with the furniture belonging
to it, also one Cow and half to her and her Heirs forever

Item I give to my Daughter Sarah Strange, one shilling sterling to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I give to my Daughter Frances Green, one shilling sterling to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I give to my Daughter Amy Jones, one shilling sterling to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I give to my Gr and Daughter Elizabeth M^cCartor, one feather Bed and furniture, also one side Saddle, to her and her Heirs forever —

Item I give to my Daughter Tabitha Morgan, all the Rest and Residue of my Estate, not heretofore mentioned, of what nature or kind soever To her and her Heirs for Ever —

Item I thereby nominate and appoint my friend George Adams and my Daughter Tabitha Morgan, my whole and sole Executors and Trustees of this my last Will and Testament, utterly Revoking and Disannulling all other Wills or Writings, in that sort, by me ever heretofore made, or Executed. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Tenth Day of February, in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy three.
