Item

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Samuel Holt my Negro Girl named Paddy to him and his heirs forever and to be delivered to him at Lawfull age

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Martha Holt my Negro Girl named Dilly to her and her heirs forever and to be delivered to her at Lawfull age as also one Feather bed and Furniture

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson W^m Holt my Negro Girl named Sundry to him and his heirs forever and to be delivered to him at Lawfull age

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Samuel Gregory son of W^m Gregory my Negro Girl named Sarah to him and his heirs forever and to be delivered to him at Lawfull age my desire is that the above mentioned Negroes left to my Grand Children above mentioned may be hired out by my Executors untill they arrive at Lawfull age at the money to be put at Interest for their Use

Item

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Holt the use of my Negroes named Dick, Tab, and Edith to her during her life and her husband Nicholas Holt and after their decease I give the said Negroes and their Offspring unto my Grand children Surviving from Nicholas Holt & Sarah his wife to them and their heirs forever

Security due unto Law and Liberty is granted the other Executor to Join in the Probate when he shal be set on at a Court held for the said County the 6th day of September 1669 This said Will was further Proved by the Oath of Origin Madee a thine Widows Thurst and Obedient Recorder his truly Runc

This Indenture made the fourth day of September in the year four hundred and seven hundred and sixty nine Between Elizabeth Thompson of the parish of Westover in the County of Charles City of the one part and W^m Graddock and Mary his wife of the same Parish and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Elizabeth Thompson as well for and in consideration of the Natural love and Affection which she hath and doth bear unto the said W^m Graddock and Mary his wife as for an open consideration of the sum of five Shillings current money of Virginia to her in hand paid by the said William Graddock as is before the Sealing and Delivery of these presents the receipt whereof she doth hereby acknowledge hath given granted bargained sold and by these Presents doth give grant bargain sell and forever Surrender Quiet all right Title or Interest unto the said W^m Graddock and Mary his wife and their heirs forever of and in a certain Division of Land containing by estimation fifty Acres more or less lying and being in the Parish of County of Charles City which said Division of Land was Divided unto the said Elizabeth Thompson during her Natural life by the last will and Testament of Ling Thompson deceased (bearing Date the Tenth day of March one thousand six hundred Sixty one and recorded in the County Court of Charles City Presence being thereunto her may more fully and at large appear) and after her decease to descend & go unto the said Mary Graddock wife of the said W^m Party to these presents and her heirs forever In witness whereof the said Elizabeth Thompson hath hereunto set her hand and Affixe her seal this day and year above written
