Will and Testament - first I recommend my Soul to God that gave

 My will and desire is that my Executors hereafter mentioned shall as
 much of my Land together with what I have etc my Brother John Gregory
 and my Brother in Law John Gregory as will pay all my Just debts and
 the Residue of all my Estate both real and personal I give to my loving
 Wife Lucy except the Land after mentioned to her and her Heirs forever
 with this Condition that Whereas she is now pregnant and should the
 Child arrive to Lawfull age or marriage, my Will is that the Child
 be it son or Daughter should have one half my Estate and after my
 Wifes decease the other half to him or her and his or her Heirs forever
 I give my two Brothers Samuel and William Gregory one hundred and
 fifty Acres of Land each to be laid off the East side of Baness Bridge
 Road joining the Mill Swamp I appoint William Green Munford
 and William Gregory Sen^r my Executors as Witnesses my hand this
 2^d day of January 1773
